Ann serves as a presbyter in the Nidd Valley Circuit, and is our District Presbyterian Synod Secretary. She is married to Ray, a retired Deacon.

He has taught in theological colleges and universities and is currently Head of the University of Leicester's Vaughan Centre for Lifelong Learning and an International Research Consultant at the Queen's Foundation. He enjoyed helping people think creatively about how faith, life and popular culture interweave, and what happens to theology as a result.

05 Revd Professor David Wilkinson

David is Principal of St Johns College and Professor in the Department of Theology & Religion in Durham University. Before working in Durham as a theologian, he was a scientist and then a Methodist minister in inner city Liverpool. David's background is in theoretical astrophysics, and his PhD was in the study of star formation, the chemical evolution of galaxies and terrestrial mass extinctions. His current work involves the relationship of Christian theology to contemporary culture. He has had a long interest in the dialogue of science and religion, especially as it impacts the physical sciences.

Elaine works for Newcastle upon Tyne District as an Evangelism Enabler. She's passionate about helping the church rediscover it's call to make disciples.
